Long Term Care Facilities Armstrong - For residents or patients who need long term care, medical or otherwise, care and housing are provided by long term care facilities. Residents in a long term care facility need enough care that they require supervision 24 hours a day, but they don't need to be confined in a hospital for medical reasons. Some may spend most of their lives in a care facility while others can spend a few months in one.

Homes for the mentally ill, convalescent homes and skilled nursing homes are various types of facilities that are considered long term care facilities. The staff in these different facilities will be different depending upon location, kind of facility, and local policies. Top rated facilities will have a variety of well trained personnel available to offer a lot of different services so that the patient receives proper care, ideally without having to be transported to treatment sessions. Personnel in a long term facility may include counselors, as well as occupational and physical therapists, and other professionals which could help patients and their families while recovering from an illness or injury.

Depending on the conditions of people in long term care facilities, their needs can vary considerably. Several patients might only need short term care after a surgical procedure, injury, or other event, such as a stroke. These people might need twenty four hour help and supervision with the whole thing from medical needs to personal requirements such as eating, bathing, going to the bathroom and getting dressed. Others might not have medical requirements, but may not be able to take care of themselves in other ways. Numerous individuals go into a long term care facility with an illness or injury and could recover and learn how to care for themselves, eventually allowing them to return home. Other people may have problems which are simply too severe or conditions which cannot be cured, meaning that they will likely be unable to leave the care facility. It is very common for individuals with dementia to require more care than could be provided at home, unless the person or family is wealthy enough to be able to employ private, full-time care. Even in a facility that may have lots of individuals with dementia, the cost could still be quite high. Many people have medical insurance to help them prepare for the event that they may need long term care in the future. If not, the financial burden would then fall into the responsibility of the person or the person's family. The government may also be required to pay for some of the expenses of care.

Depending on the needs of each and every person, there are various kinds of long term care facilities to pick from. The kind of facility that houses people with the least level of need are normally referred to as custodial care facilities. Typically, people in these facilities require minimal to no medical care, but require observation. Naturally, intermediate care facilities provide a moderate level of care. Individuals in these facilities might need some nursing care, but their requirements are not extreme. The kind of facility that houses people with extreme medical requirements is commonly called a skilled nursing facility. These facilities give patients the highest level of care, but are also the most expensive. Amongst the most common kinds of long term care facilities is the family home. Although many people would choose to stay at home while they grow old, it might not always be feasible. When a family needs to place another member of the family into a care facility, it is always better that they visit frequently, both to make certain that the individual is getting proper care and to provide a social life for the individual.
